



- Cans made of tinplate or aluminium
- Paint or varnish tins (completely empty)
- Paint buckets made of tinplate (completely empty)
- Beer cans
- Coffee cans
- Empty aerosol cans
- Food cans
- Frozen food trays
- Juice cans
- Metal caps
- Pie tins
- Soda cans (not returnable)
- Pet food cans made of tinplate or aluminium





- **>** bring back to the store: returnable cans
- ➤ into the Scrap Metal Bin : metal or aluminium parts which are not wrapping (e.g. small amounts of cables, iron tubes, pans and pots)
- ➤ into the Yellow Bag: vacuum packaging for coffee
- ➤ to the scrap dealer or scrapyard: car parts, motorbikes and mopeds


